



PASTOR'S NOTES

Short and Sweet

Over the recent months a small group of us have been working on our “social media presence” and part of that work has been addressing the usefulness of our current web site. Some of you might be thinking “we have a web site?” and others might be thinking “if it isn’t broke...” because there are one or two things on the current web site that can be easily found. What we discovered is that one of the reasons those couple of things can be easily found is because it is difficult to make changes to the current platform.

We are moving toward brevity in our narratives, including trying to describe Presbyterian beliefs. One of the folks in our group came across a synopsis from the book “How to Spell Presbyterian” and we have trimmed, tweaked, and finagled it to the following.

We Presbyterians hold in common our need and desire for forgiveness, our representative system of governance and organization, and our ministries of participation in God’s ongoing work, wherever we are. We proclaim Jesus Christ as Savior, who makes us new in our own lives and in our lives together.

We gather in worship settings to pray, to praise God, to be instructed by the Word read and proclaimed, to sing, and to celebrate our sacramental connections. We then go out from worship to share the joys, the responsibilities, and the opportunities of showing God’s love through our words and actions.

Presbyterians generally share these key beliefs:

God has been revealed to us through Jesus, both fully human and fully divine;

Jesus reveals love that will never disappoint us but also expects much of us;

We are saved by God’s grace, which we cannot earn, but only gratefully accept;

As grateful people we have no time for hate;

We need each other – Christianity is most deeply expressed in community;

Jesus has commissioned us to continue works of justice, mercy, and love;

We are called to care for all creation;

The future belongs to God, who uses us to fulfill God’s purposes.

As a brief overview, that seems like a good start. Many a Presbyterian might add, refute, or re-state a sentence or two, but then again, maybe not. After all, these ideas are held in common, not chiseled in stone. Which is somewhat like web sites that share common vision, goals, and purposes yet also hold flexibility to adapt. We will keep everyone posted when the new site is up and active.



Hi Painters!


Attached is a photo of the house and the address in east Fort Worth of the project that we will paint this Saturday, October 3.

HOPE Farm’s Purpose: provide a leadership program focused on guiding at-risk boys to become Christ-centered men of integrity. They have a campus in Como near our new church, and also in the Morningside area. During the COVID pandemic they are providing classrooms and leaders to help 22 middle school boys follow through with their online schooling. They have small classrooms of 6 students maximum, where an adult assists the boys as they work with the lessons provided online by their FWISD teachers. They serve the boys breakfast, lunch and snacks, and breakfast bars are a favorite pick-me-up for any time during the day.

Session Meeting Notes for September 17, 2020

- The RPC regular stated session meeting took place on Thursday, September 17, 2020, using the Zoom video conferencing application. The Reverend Roger Harwerth moderated the meeting from his office. Members of the Session and guests to the meeting remotely accessed the meeting. All elders were in attendance at the meeting.
- An update on the church's insurance policies was presented. The church has three insurance policies: workers' compensation, bus & trailer insurance, and a multi-risk policy that includes the building & its contents, liability, theft, etc. These policies were reviewed in August.
- The older portion of the building and the sanctuary sustained hail damage in April. An insurance claim has been filed, and we are awaiting the final adjustment amount. The Building & Equipment Committee is moving ahead with plans to get an estimate on the cost to repair the roof.
- A motion was made to reconsider the previous action of the Session to not hold on-site worship services until there is a 14-day decline in COVID-19 cases in Tarrant County. The motion failed. We will continue to not have any on-site worship or large group activities at this time.
- The next stated session meeting will be Thursday, October 22, 2020, at 7:00 p.m. via Zoom video conference. The meeting is scheduled for the fourth Thursday of the month (instead of the usual third Thursday) because Rev. Harwerth will be gone for continuing education during the week of the regularly scheduled meeting.
- RPC member Emily Everts will serve as supply pastor on Sunday, October 18th in Rev. Harwerth's absence. Emily is a Candidate for Ordination in the Presbyterian Church and is a student at Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary.
- A Stated Grace Presbytery meeting is scheduled for Saturday, November 14, 2020, at Canyon Creek Presbyterian Church, 3901 North Star Road, in Richardson, Texas.
