### **Can You Believe It?**

Over the recent months a handful of folks have been working together to update our congregation's web-site, and we are almost ready to "launch" this new platform. Actually, you may be reading this newsletter on our

new site!! We have engaged the services of a web designer who has helped more than a dozen congregations, and this has been a good experience for all of us who have been involved.

One of the goals for this update is to be more visual and less textual, and to refresh much of the text that had been utilized. To that end, a new heading of "What We Believe" was created, that combines our past, present, and future, celebrating our connectional fabric.

### What We Believe

The first sentence of the Presbyterian Church (USA)'s Book of Order states that "The good news of the Gospel is that the triune God ... creates, redeems, sustains, rules, and transforms all things and all people." Such a wide-ranging statement reminds us that Ridglea Presbyterian Church (RPC) is connected to the broad sweep of the history and the future of the Church universal. We affirm that, by the power of the Holy Spirit, this one living God is incarnate in Jesus Christ, who came to live in the world, die for the world, and be raised again to new life. The gospel of Jesus Christ announces the nearness of God's kingdom, bringing good news to all who are impoverished, sight to all who are blind, freedom to all who are oppressed, and proclaiming the Lord's favor upon all creation. Within the Synod of the Sun, within Grace Presbytery, and within our neighborhood, RPC strives to be a community of faith, a community of hope, and community of love, and a community of witness, pointing beyond itself through word and work to the good news of God's transforming grace. #### Some Thoughts on Giving \*

Walt

We may want to tiptoe around the issue of money and giving; we are uncomfortable with it. Jesus, however, reminds us that it is an issue of the heart. He says in Matthew 6:21 "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

We should give to please God. In doing so find we may find our greatest joy.

In 2 Corinthians 9:6-7, Paul tells us "The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

The Greek word for *cheerful* that Paul uses is the same word from which we get *hilarious*. This is the only use of this word in the Bible. The word connotes overflowing, joyful, and yes, hilarious giving. Giving should be one of our greatest joys.

Paul says that we should give as we have made up our mind (or perhaps we might say as we have decided in our heart). God does not need our money. He has created everything, is creating now, and will always be creating. While we should try not to make foolish decisions, we often limit our giving by what we think is possible. Why not give as if God really is in charge of what we have? Just give. No organization to which we give is perfect; our church is not perfect. Just give with joy and let God will take care of the rest. He loves a cheerful giver.

Just say <u>I will give</u>. And do it.





## Presbyterian Women

## NOVEMBER, 2020.

Even in a year as tough as this, we are surrounded by blessings. This is the month Presbyterian Women get an opportunity to bring blessings to many. The "Thank Offering" is one of the special offerings we participate in. Since 1988, this offering has provided \$26 million to nearly 1,700 different projects worldwide. This year fifteen new projects will be funded, two international.

- 1) Democratic Republic of Congo will be able to finish a building project, a place for women to gather and receive leadership training.
- 2) Gidada Theological College in Ethiopia will construct a woman's dormitory.

Our own Synod of the Sun will receive two grants:

- 1) Stillwater Domestic Violence Services can add additional services to children living in shelters.
- 2) Ferncliff Camp and Conference Center will purchase a truck to pick up and deliver disaster kits from depots in the South. Our youth group visited here several years ago on a mission trip.

Other Synods received grants that would:

- assist older adults and people with disabilities
- provide learning helps and programs for refugee youth
- counseling and training for low income girls
- help rural food pantries deliver needed goods
- support community kitchens for local food production

Stockings must be returned to the church by November 23 so that we can complete filling them and get them to the PCHS.
