

### **PASTOR'S NOTES**



### Seasons

A couple of days ago my eyes were drawn to a book down on a low shelf that I hadn't paid attention to since putting it there more than a year ago. More than a coffee-table book, but not quite a manual of operations, this is *The Tool Book* by W. B. Logan (© 1997 by Smith and Hawken). There are sections on all sorts of implements, from the ordinary and familiar to unusual and specialized (such as the Slingo spade, originally from Holland, and the Newcastle draining tool, originally from England).

Skimming through *The Tool Book* reminded me that in the corner of our garage is a wonderful

collection of long-handled tools that have accumulated over the decades, some having come from my Grandad's farm in Atwood, Kansas. One of those is a rake whose handle is notched every sixteen inches; Grandad told me he did that so that he could keep his vegetable rows spaced evenly.

Because we moved into our house in mid-April, there wasn't time (or energy) to get a garden started before the Texas heat fell like a blanket. My initial hope was to hold off until the middle of May before turning on our lawn sprinklers, which stretched into a wetter-than-usual June, and the rains tapered off in July, so the sprinklers stayed off, while the yard kept getting mowed. July brought some triple-digit days but there were also a couple of day-and-ahalf stretches of rain, so out came the Snapper every week, and I began to think that it might be August before needing to water the yard. August ended the way it began, which was basically a

continuation of July: hot and hotter, with a smattering of rain every five to eight days.



Now, here we are in the last week of September, experiencing a classic autumn, with

warmish days and coolish nights and this is being written while rain is falling for the first time in about nine or ten days, and more rain forecast for the next forty-eight or more hours. Six months ago who would have imagined mowing without watering all the way into October? It will be next spring, or early summer, before our home sprinkler system is given much more thought.

These months without running the sprinklers could be considered a blessing, yet it is also a blessing to know they were available if needed. The same goes for those garden tools that languish in the garage. (*some* of them pictured above)

It is hoped that this is also true for discipling, for our journeys of being witness to the living word of God. It may have been a while since we thought about those discussions, studies, or sermons that touched on topics like hospitality, sanctification, evil, justice, hope, or evangelism, but isn't it a blessing to know that those tools are at the ready? Such "tools" are there, in the presence of our families, friends, and colleagues. When our lives become brittle, when troubles entangle us, there is almost always someone who can help, whether it is clearing a path, or simply sitting, reflecting, and waiting with us for the next season.

Just as there are a lot of variations and uses for gardening tools (enough for a book!) there are also opportunities and possibilities for the tools of faith-filled living, stretching from the generations upon whose wisdom we trust to the hopes that we look for on tomorrow's horizon.

Let's plan to arrive in time to begin painting by 8:30 a.m. this Saturday.


Plan to bring any particular items you wish to have for painting. Gloves, step stools, ladders, hats, sunscreen, bug spray, etc. may improve your experience.

The most effective way to disrupt poverty is to work with parents and children equally and simultaneously, so that transformation lasts into the next generation.



Homelessness in early childhood is associated with delays in language, literacy, and social-emotional development, and CTL seeks to mitigate these delays. The younger and longer a child experiences homelessness, the greater the cumulative toll of negative health outcomes, which can have lifelong effects on the child, the family, and the community. (Schoolhouse Connection).

Additionally, access to high quality child care lifts up the entire family. When a single mother knows her child is safe with a trusted caregiver, she can pursue an education or seek employment that will contribute to long-term stability.
