PASTOR'S NOTES



Stretching Faith

When I was younger, I loved throwing a baseball. We'd play catch in the backyard, in the street, up at the school. I wasn't all that interested in playing the game of baseball, just throwing and catching. What I particularly liked was the sound of the ball whizzing through the air, and the "thwack!" when the ball hit the glove. I remember times when Randy and Greg and I would be out in the backyard just throwing the ball to each other as hard and fast as we could, until our hands hurt. In seminary I started playing a lot of softball, and learned that those big old things can really make a gorgeous sound smacking into the web of a glove.

In my first pastorate (in the late 1980's) I was part of a softball league, with a bunch of guys who played more for the fun of being together than to win trophies, which was great for my limited skills. I was having a great time until my shoulder kept hurting more and more. When I finally had someone look at it, the doctor said "I bet you just pick up the ball and start throwing, and try to throw it as hard as you can, don't you?"

"Well, sure," I said, "and why does that matter?"

It mattered because, since I was not stretching my arms and shoulders, and since I was not gradually working up to throwing faster and faster, I had been aggravating the bursa sac in my right shoulder. To top it off, then the doctor said it mattered because I wasn't getting any younger! Remembering those words, I think the only thing wounded more than my shoulder was my pride — I hadn't even gotten to middle age and I was suffering from bursitis.

In the years since then (okay, in the decades since then) I haven't played much softball, or even catch for that matter, but I tried to take care of my shoulders, with a thorough routine of stretching before golfing, skiing, or weight-lifting. Taking care of my shoulders means that I rarely have trouble with them, and can enjoy many outdoor activities. And when I forget to stretch, my right shoulder reminds me for weeks on end!

It is a combination of those painful memories and a bit of maturity that brings the wisdom of preparing, of getting ready for particular activities, be they sporting or contemplative. There is a lot to be said for building up, slowly but surely; of taking time to do things right, not just fast. In a way, that is the message of the season of Advent. As we joyfully anticipate the celebration of the birth of the Christ-child, we are also mindful of the call to prepare our hearts, our minds, our world for the return of Christ.

Back in 1999, with the impending millennium, and then again in 2012 with the looming conclusion of the ancient Mayan calendar, a lot of time and energy was spent equating major "calendar events" with the return of Christ – forgetting that, among other things, every time someone has come up with a time-frame for the second coming of the Lord they have been, to put it bluntly, wrong. The overriding message of the Advent season is not trying to guess the day and time and circumstances surrounding Christ's return, but to make sure that the ways we live out our faith are true to the expectations of discipleship, of stewardship, of humility and mercy and love. Expectations which Jesus modeled and taught and, yes, died for.

I encourage you, this holiday season, to take the time to stretch your faith, to warm up to the spirit of this "giving season" and to make sure that you are "in shape" for whatever God brings to you and your loved ones. Have a peaceful Advent, and a joyous Christmas, and see you next year!

The Teachers' Note


Happy Christmas season all!
