#### **PASTOR'S NOTES**



#### Here We Go

A little over a month ago I read about work that the Barna Research Group had undertaken; the subject was the increasing number of clergy who have considered leaving ministry, and those who have actually departed from ministry, in the previous year. Between January and October that number had grown to 38% of clergy considering, or having left ministry – an increase of nine percent in only ten months. That is the "headline" of the study, and there are quite a few details that provide deeper insights, such as age, gender, years of service, and denominational affiliation. For instance, those who have been in ministry longer than twenty years, but in their current position for less than seven make up a full third of the thirty-eight percent who are considering leaving; pastors from mainline denominations are more likely to consider resigning, as are more females than males; and more pastors under the age of forty-five are considering leaving ministry than those over forty-five.

I shared this information with the session in November, but also shared my reflections of this report. My first reaction to the research is that sixty-two percent of clergy are not considering leaving ministry, and after 18-plus months of pandemic I am still firmly in that group of sixty-two percent. I could make a joke of staying and say that I don't know how to do anything else, but that humor would be at the expense of many of my colleagues who have left ministry with the same skill-set I possess and share. For me, understanding that I have a supportive family, starting with Brenda, and the on-going relationships with my colleagues, particularly the STM group, and experiencing the support of this congregation is why I am a part of the sixty-two percent who are not considering leaving ministry.

The staff, the session, the deacons, the committees, the volunteers; the energy that reverberates through Ridglea continues to amaze and challenge the what and how and where of ministry for me, and I can hardly wait to experience what 2022 brings. Here we go!



- The Ridglea Presbyterian Church regular stated session meeting took place on Thursday, December 16, 2021, in RPC Room 207. The Reverend Roger Harwerth moderated the meeting. RPC Clerk Karen Landon took the minutes of the meeting. Also in attendance was John Sauvey, Director of Music.
- The minutes of the November 18, 2021, stated session meeting and the November budgeted financial statement were approved.
- The RPC Child and Youth Protection Policy and the List of RPC Sunday School Teachers and Leaders were approved with no changes.
- The session is required to annually review the Roll of Active Members. No action was taken on removing or deleting active members from the rolls during this period of ongoing pandemic.
- The annual review of insurance policies was completed by the Building & Equipment Committee.
- Annual reviews with all RPC employees will be completed by the end of December. Pastoral terms of call were also reviewed and changes to those terms will be recommended to the congregation for review and vote at its annual meeting.
- The session approved the 2022 Budget.
- The next RPC stated session meeting will be Thursday, January 20, 2021, at 7:00 p.m. in the church sanctuary.
- The annual meeting of the congregation will be January 30, 2022 following the 10:30 a.m. worship service.



#### JANUARY JUST BRING IT!

Our January "Just Bring It" will be for <a href="new toddler board books">new toddler board books</a> and <a href="pre-school paperbacks">pre-school paperbacks</a> for children served by the Center for Transforming Lives. For 114 years, this organization (formerly known as the Fort Worth YWCA<sup>TM</sup>) has provided anti-poverty programs for women and children in Tarrant County. The first YWCA<sup>TM</sup> in Texas, it opened in 1907 as a boarding house for poor women, expanded over the years to include child care and other social services, and in 2015 changed its name to the Center for Transforming Lives. The organization serves over 3,500 women, children and families annually, breaking the cycle of poverty through:

Homeless Services – an on-site homeless shelter for women and off-site homes for families.

Early Childhood Education – providing free or subsidized early childhood education to impoverished and homeless families.

Economic Mobility – individual financial coaching and other programs to promote financial self-sufficiency.
