

#### **PASTOR'S NOTES**



#### A Little Tug

A couple of weeks ago I brought a small bag of plastic pieces to the time for children during the Service of Worship. The pieces were for a Lego toy, but it was hard to figure out what those pieces might become, just jumbled in the bag. I then showed the children the instruction manual that would show how those pieces could be put together into a race car. From there I talked about the Bible being similar to a Lego manual ass we build lives of kindness and love. At the end of our time together I told the children that I would put the pieces together and show them next week how it turned out.

A few days later I put together Lego model #4584, which the box calls the "Hot Scorcher" and it has a "Pull-Back Motor" which works just like its name: place the car on the floor, pull back 6-8 inches, let go and watch it zip along. Cool! The model went together easily, and I gave it a few test runs in the office, and the next Sunday brought it to show the children the results of following instruction. I put the car down, pulled back, let go, and...no zip, no motion, nothing. As soon as I picked it up the wheels spun, releasing their energy, but the congregation could not see that. I moved to another spot in the sanctuary, then another, with identical results: nothing. I could feel the spring-loaded tension as I pulled the car back, but when I let go there was no response, no motion. It was fairly comical in the moment, and I made some remarks about pastors and humility and plans going awry, and then continued with the next part of the service.

Whether we are dealing with a Lego manual or a cooking recipe or scripture, we often think that if we "just follow directions" then things will work, whether those things are toys, pies, or relationships. And most of the time things do work out, run smooth and taste great, don't they? Yet there are times of surprise, and failure, and mystery, times when the instruction manual points us in a direction, or shows us a picture, while skipping a few details, like humor, grief, obstinance, or weariness. Sometimes we put the pieces together, set things down, pull back, and whatever we expected just doesn't happen.

There are usually all sorts of reasons for these unexpected moments, and there are often ways of adapting to find new solutions or choices. Scripture is filled with examples of relationships going cross-wise and then coming back to a new form of wholeness – the book of Genesis starts this understanding as it tells about God and humanity and how that relationship goes wonky and then keeps going and going.

When the service was over and I picked up the Lego car to return to my office, I was still wondering why it wouldn't zip forward, so instead of pulling it back, it gently pushed it forward, and that's when I noticed that the front tires were bound up – they had been squeezed onto the axles and didn't spin freely. A little tug on each front wheel, set it down, pull it back and that car really zipped across the floor. What was needed was a bit of patience, observation, and a little tug to the side, and things were working smoothly. Seems like a little metaphor for life, to me.

## Presbyterian Women

### February, 2022

A "Thank You" letter arrived in the mail last week from PW, Inc., the national organization. It was a response to the \$390.00 Thank Offering we sent. We give to missions in faith knowing it will be used to help our neighbors. Sometimes we are surprised just who are our neighbors! Our PW magazine, Horizons, often gives us a glimpse. In 2020, a grant from the Birthday Offering (which is coming this Spring) was given to the Orthodox Church of the Vladimir Icon of the Mother of God ion Davydovo, Russia. It helped construct two buildings for their Center for Social Assistance to the Disabled, Family and Children. This assisted living facility includes a house for adults with special needs and their tutor. They are learning self-care skills, including cooking and cleaning. The second building, the Medical and Cultural Center is used for community gatherings and will soon include a medical clinic and a dental clinic. As one resident was quoted, "We do not want to be treated as a crystal vase or as a dying person, but as an ordinary person". Father Vladimir was overjoyed that Presbyterian Women would help them fill their needs. He remarked, "Many thanks from your sisters and brothers in Russia!"





### Session Meeting Notes for January 20, 2021

- The Ridglea Presbyterian Church regular stated session meeting took place on Thursday, January 20, 2022, in the RPC Sanctuary. The Reverend Roger Harwerth moderated the meeting. RPC Clerk Karen Landon took the minutes of the meeting. All elders were present. Also in attendance were John Sauvey, Director of Music, and Lynne Payne, Moderator of the Deacons.
- The minutes of the December 16, 2021, stated session meeting and the December budgeted financial statement were approved.
- The 2021 End-of-Year Reports from committees and congregational groups were received and approved by the Session.
- An update was given regarding RPC member Emily Everts, who is an Inquirer in the Presbyterian Church. Emily will graduate from Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary with a Masters of Divinity degree on May 15, 2022. Emily will soon meet with the Committee of Preparation for Ministry for the next steps to become a Candidate for Ordination.
- The Worship Committee is beginning the process of buying 100 new hymnals (*Glory to God*, 2013). The Session approved congregation donations of \$20.00 per hymnal. Donors have the option of including an in-house sticker printed and placed on the inside front cover designating the hymnal in honor or in memory of someone.
- The session approved the RPC Foundation election of Ken Kibler to the Foundation Board of Directors for a 3-year term.
- Stated session meetings are held on the 3rd Thursday of each month. The session voted to change the June session meeting from June 16, 2022 to June 23, 2022, and the September meeting from September 15, 2022 to September 22, 2022. This will give committees time to meet and prepare reports prior to the session meetings.
- The next RPC stated session meeting will be Thursday, February 17, 2022, at 7:00 p.m. in the church sanctuary.
- The annual meeting of the congregation will be January 30, 2022 following the 10:30 a.m. worship service.
- The stated meeting of Grace Presbytery will take place Saturday, February 12, 2022, at Trinity Presbyterian Church in McKinney. This meeting will be offered in a hybrid format with members attending in-person or virtually.



## **February Just Bring It**

It's Prayer Bear time again! The chaplains at Cook Children's pass out over 15,000 prayer bears most year, all donated by congregations and caring friends. As a reminder, here are the guidelines for Prayer Bears:

- 1. All bears MUST be new with tags still on them.
