PASTOR'S NOTES

Dating Myself

Nearly every year I have thought about writing a reflection on my favorite day. And nearly every year, I have also thought about writing a reflection on my least favorite day. I have tried to create monthly newsletter articles since late 1994, but

over all those years the favorite/least-favorite day reflections have been set aside as other topics or moments have bubbled to the forefront.

As that favorite day approached this year, it occurred to me that perhaps I was in need of a cultural reference, something that would help people to grasp an affinity for certain dates on a calendar, and what came to mind was a quote from the movie "Miss Congeniality." Maybe you remember that in one of the scenes, the beauty-pageant character of Miss Rhode Island was asked to describe her "perfect date," and after a moment came the reply: "I'd have to say April 25th, because it's not too hot, not too cold ... all you need is a light jacket." It's a funny little moment, and that day also happens to be really close to our wedding anniversary (April 26), so maybe that would be a good way to introduce a "favorite day" reflection. Wanting to make sure the quote was accurate, I did a quick search, which lead to a realization that the movie is over 22 years old already! Would a 22-year old reference be meaningful? Then I remembered that "May the Fourth be with you," a tongue-in-cheek appropriation of the Star Wars movies, goes back to 1977, so Miss Congeniality would probably be alright.

The summer solstice has long been one of my favorite days, because the maximum amount of daylight invigorates and infuses my sense of connection with creation. Even in a year such as this, when the 100-degree-plus temperature of the afternoon was still in the upper-90's as the sun set on the horizon of Fort Worth; even as I was enjoying air-conditioned comfort inside our home, just knowing that there had been more than 14 hours of daylight renewed my spirit on June 21st. The 22nd and 23rd of June were just as hot, and nearly as long; by the time this piece is published, however, we will have lost a couple of bright, shiny minutes to the quickening twilight. By the winter solstice daylight will be down to little more than 10 hours, and I will be longing for sunshine even as we celebrate the natal star resting over Bethlehem.

In my head I understand that the solstice is related to the tilt of the earth's axis and its elliptical orbit, but the rest of me – heart and soul – yearns for sunshine, even as it plays havoc with sinuses and skin cells and climate concerns ("the rest of me" also remembers that for two years we were in the Seattle area, where the summer-to-winter sunshine ratio drops nearly 7 ½ hours, and dusk seemed to come about fifteen minutes after lunch). My head also knows that there are plenty of other wonderful days of the calendar, but the rest of me relishes the spring-into-summer extravaganza of daylight, even as I worry about drought and melting glaciers and power grids (we have bumped our thermostat up, again, to ease some of that burden).

The pathways of discipleship can be experienced like the growth and diminishment of daylight, abounding and abating through seasons and experiences that are both regular and unexpected. We can look forward to the brightness of celebrations and milestones; we can put in extra effort to learn and share; we can cultivate hope. When sorrow comes knocking, when grief is underfoot, when doubt lingers like the ear-worm of a melancholy melody, it may seem as if darkness will languish everlasting. The pathways of discipleship, thankfully, are traveled with others who remind us of the light, who remind us that darkness is fleeting, who help carry our burdens.

Each June the summer solstice fills me with joy, and each December the winter solstice fills me with hope. And the years are filled with faithful companions, thanks be to God.

GETTING TO KNOW OUR MEMBERS PAUL DUNCAN



Paul recently retired from Lockheed Martin Aeronautics as F-16 Production Engineering Senior Manager for F-16 Blk 70 new build in Greenville SC. Prior roles included Supervisor of Avionics Test in F-22 Flightline Production Operations in Marietta, GA, Associate Manager of F-22 Flightline Operations, F-35 Manufacturing Test Engineering Manager and Senior Manager F-35 Production Engineering. In 2019 Paul served as the program coordinator for the F-35 Production Engineering

Professional (PEP) Program and was Certified a PEP as part of the original class in June of 2019.

Paul previously served 22 years in the United States Air Force. While involved in F-16 Operations for 22 years highlight assignments include 3 years with The United Stated Air Force "Thunderbirds" (Crew Chief on Thunderbird #1 1987), 5 years working in the F-16 System Program Office as the F-16 Avionics Field Support Manager, one Gulf tour in Saudi Arabia in Support of Operation "DENY FLIGHT" and 2 and ½ years as a member of Headquarters Air Combat Command Staff as F-16 Liaison Officer to Lockheed Martin Aeronautics in Fort Worth.

Paul's degree is in Avionics Technology and Aviation Management from the Community College of the Air Force. Additionally he holds Program Management Certification from in residence attendance of the Defense Systems Management College. He is married to his wife Beth and they have a son Daniel (26) and daughter Sarah (22).

We asked Paul some questions and here are his replies:

What marriage advice did you give Sarah before her wedding?

None, I was so proud of her and Steven and so confident in their decision. I knew he would be perfect in the "Team Duncan" family. Sarah told me the best advice I ever gave her was that I led by example and that's what meant most to her.

What is your favorite memory of RPC?

Daniel was in the Cherub Choir when we first got to RPC and he was very hesitant about getting up and singing. Kaki (Foster) was the Cherub Choir director at that time. We had a pep talk and when he got up to sing and he looked right at me and I gave him thumbs up and he gave me a thumbs up and did it.

Of all your travels which is your favorite place?

Peking China - I was able to see the Great Wall and the Forbidden City when it was still closed.

Tell us about your watch collection.

Over 90 watches and growing - I appreciate fine things, electronic and mechanical. Growing up Mom and Dad took great care of us and gave us all we needed but I saw people with REALLY nice watches. I love anything mechanical and electronic – ties into my engineering heritage with Lockheed these past 19 years.

Any advice for youth?






