PASTOR'S NOTES

Lord, Teach Us to Pray

When we were in Borger, Texas we would include a small collection of prayers in the August newsletter – some of them just a few lines long, and others more than a dozen lines long. This practice began after a conversation about prayer, when a church member mentioned that they carried a magazine clipping of an "all purpose prayer" in their wallet, just in case anyone (like me) ever asked them to open a meeting in prayer. When we left Borger in 2005 that practice of printing prayers stayed behind, but it came to mind a couple of weeks ago when working on a sermon centered on Luke's version of the Lord's Prayer (Luke 11:1-5). Luke tells us that the disciples asked Jesus to teach them to pray, and Jesus shared five short sentences, starting with addressing God (Father, hallowed (or holy) is your name), then acknowledging the divine reign (your kingdom come), followed by supplication for strength (daily bread) and for forgiveness received and shared (forgive our sins as we forgive those indebted to us), and concluding with intercession against difficulties (times of trial or tribulation). The disciples remembered that prayer and shared it with others, and it has been passed around and remembered ever since.

Back in Borger there were just a couple of books on my shelves from which those newsletter selections came, but when remembering those annual articles, just a few weeks ago, came the realization that there are now nearly a dozen volumes that are collections of prayers. That's a whole lot of prayers, and almost none of them are memorized. But a few have a "mood" that lie close to the heart, and even if the words falter, the tone rings clear. For instance, there is a prayer of hope from the Sarum Primer which goes like this:

God be in my head, and in my understanding; God be in my eyes, and in my looking; God be in my mouth, and in my speaking; God be in my heart, and in my thinking; God be at my end, and at my departing.

Even if the words escape me, the hopefulness remains. And, when a moment or a day is difficult, there is this prayer of strength, attributed to Teresa of Lisieux, which often comes to mind:

Just for today, what does it matter, O Lord, if the future is dark?

To pray now for tomorrow I am not able.

Keep my heart only for today, grant me your light –

just for today.

When the disciples asked Jesus for a lesson on prayer, they wanted a way to be identified, to be connected, to be closer to Jesus, and the divine presence he embodied. A lesson, and a tradition, we continue and share.



Session Meeting Notes for July 21, 2022

- The Ridglea Presbyterian Church regular stated session meeting took place on Thursday, July 21, 2022, in the RPC Sanctuary. The Reverend Roger Harwerth moderated the meeting, and RPC Clerk Karen Landon took the minutes. Lynne Payne, Moderator of the Deacons, was also in attendance.
- The minutes of the June 23, 2022, stated session meeting and the June Budgeted Financial Statement were approved.
- Dale Wagner reported that he and George Tischler attended a conference about church security in June. The session authorized the formation of an ad hoc committee to begin the process of creating a church safety and security plan.
- The Building and Equipment Committee has drafted a new kitchen policy. It will be posted in the kitchen.

The men's prayer breakfast has been a vital part of Ridglea's mission and ministry for decades.


