PASTOR'S NOTES

Bless You

Has this ever happened – driving to a place where everything is different, and when dinner time comes, all the familiar places are an hour or two behind? That happened to me recently, and when finally pulling off the highway, there were only a few options to choose from, and the closest one just happened to be a never-been-tried fast food chicken establishment. When the drive-up window voice asked, just 2 seconds later, "How may we help you?" there were about 97 options on the screen. "Well, I'll have a grilled chicken sandwich, please, and iced tea; I don't know which combo that is, sorry."

Usually the order is repeated back to the customer, but instead, this time there was only silence. In those long, quiet moments, it became clear that every option on the screen was a variation of chicken strips and sides, without a sandwich to be found. No wonder there was silence – those chicken specialists on the other side of the screen were likely stunned by the concept of unbreaded meat between a bun, toasted or otherwise.

Recovering quickly, I apologized to the screen – again – and confessed that this was my first visit, and how about combo #6, a simple 3-strip basket with a roll, please? Relief and thanks poured out of the window voice, with a small chuckle, and I pulled forward, paying for and then receiving my meal.

Since this was a new experience, and being unsure how the various elements of chicken strips, fries, and a biscuit might be arranged, after a couple of moments and a couple of blocks I pulled over, parked, and opened the box. Inside, on top of everything, was a hand-written note: "Thank you for making your first visit to Chicken Express here with us in Gilmer, TX. In appreciation, we have added extra chicken fingers. Bless you." There was so much chicken, plus an over-abundance of fries, plus an extra biscuit – it was so amazing, and so delicious!

I sat for a few moments, nearly stunned by such a small act of kindness, toward an absolute stranger, for no reason other than being present.

This is what grace looks like, in a simple, unexpected, personal way: a moment of kindness, and the receipt of blessings, unbidden, unwarranted, unexpected.

Often, we spend so much time talking about the theology of God-given grace that we overlook how and when and why it happens to us in our everyday lives. But God's grace is all around us.
















COME JOIN US! August 5, 2023, 6:00 p.m. Dinner With Friends (previously Dinner for 8) (1st Saturday of the month)

Matthew 25 Action Team Attends Forum on Homelessness



We had a large turnout for the Fort Worth City Council sponsored forum June 26 on Homelessness. It was good to realize there is such a large coalition of agencies working on this issue. Over and over we heard people say the goal is to get people into homes. The other thing we heard was surprising. All the speakers urged us not to give money to panhandlers. They said the money was better spent going to agencies who were working to get people off the streets and into homes. That was hard for some of us to hear. They also suggested calling the police or your MPO to report an issue of someone always being on a corner. The phone calls get recorded and provide stats, so the City knows better where to provide resources.


