PASTOR'S NOTES

Telling the Truth

On their first visit, they all sat on the back pew. The pastor spotted them during the first hymn: Mom and Dad, and four children, from toddler to maybe fourth grade. Oops, wait, there was child number five, in a baby carrier. They visited again, a few weeks later, and Josh, the dad, asked if he could stop by and visit the pastor, which was easy to arrange.

There was a bit of small talk in the pastor's office, before Josh began to talk about his background and appreciation of reformed theology, and he and his wife's participation in an OPC congregation for the last handful of years (that's the Orthodox Presbyterian Church), which worshipped about forty-five minutes down the road, and that they - Josh and his wife - were hoping to find a Presbyterian congregation closer to home, since getting five kids wrangled and organized was becoming a bit much; they were hoping that First Presbyterian had a good foundation with Calvinist Josh added that there were three other families who were commuting to the OPC congregation down the road, and all of them were looking for a change, mostly because the OPC congregation had a fifty-something pastor that would probably stay for another fifteen years, and Josh and the other parents weren't too sure if that pastor had enough energy or really even enough understanding of Calvinist, reformed theology. With a small pause for emphasis Josh remarked that altogether, he and these other families represented eight adults and at least twenty children; "at least twenty" because some of the wives were still having babies. So pastor, Josh asked, how does First Presbyterian exhibit, and live out Calvinist, reformed theology??

As Josh was asking about reformed theology, the pastor's mind was racing and skittering wildly - four families and twenty-plus children - is this a dream? What reformed, Calvinist buzz-words could the pastor remember to get these families to stop commuting forty-five minutes and show up here every week? Irresistible grace, limited atonement, unconditional election, that's a good start; Orthodox Presbyterian Church, they splintered off the southern stream in the 1920's, or was it the north in the 1850's? The pastor's mind is racing around this windfall opportunity: four families!! Twenty children!! Silently, the pastor prays, "help me, God, to speak truth." So, the pastor leans in to truth.

The pastor asks if Josh might have noticed, near the entrance, the photos of people who had gone into ministry from the congregation? There were seven so far, a couple of them had been foreign missionary workers – had Josh seen those pictures? Two are young women, well, almost middle-aged now, each serving congregations a couple of states away. And, this past Sunday, the pastor noticed that Josh and his spouse were visiting with the couple in front of them, but did Josh know that the woman was currently on the session and was the chairperson for the stewardship committee? The pastor said a few more things about the importance of reformed theology, about bringing some of the strengths of John Calvin's 16th Century theology into the new millennium while also realizing that the representative nature of the PC(USA) – one of those Calvinist strengths – meant that the Holy Spirit continues to challenge Presbyterians to celebrate all the gifts of ministry and leadership with which God blesses women and men.

The pastor was letting Josh know, gently, subtly, honestly, that the congregation, and the pastor, was part of a long, biblical, reformed, albeit bumpy tradition of women sharing in leadership and discipleship; if Josh and the families of which he spoke would like to be a part of such a community, they would be welcomed and loved and affirmed. The pastor had barely paused when Josh said, uh, thanks for the time, I'm sure you are busy, and well, I need to go now; smiles, handshakes, and the pastor said that the conversation had been a real treat, and drive safe and say hello to the spouse, etc.

The door was still closing when the pastor sighed. People would ask about the family with five children, and would they be back? Children, parents, potential, and it was all so close, so exciting. Three nights later, at the session meeting, the pastor talked about the conversation with Josh. The pastor might flub a quiz on John Calvin, and might forget that the OPC began in the 1920's, but also knew that the truth was the best defense for temptation. The session agreed.

When I delivered uniforms donated by our congregation to Luella Merrett Elementary School, I received not only a thank you but a **BIG HUG** from the school counselor!



Are you interested in touring these beautiful churches in the Spring 2024?




