PASTOR'S NOTES



A Good Time to Remember

The Rev. Fred Rogers would often ask an audience to remember a person who had been an early influence on each of their lives, and he would hold their silence for 20, then 30 seconds, even a full minute before he spoke again. And when he did, he talked about the importance of the unforgettable people who have pushed, pulled, undergirded and lifted us. One of the powerful, stunning results of these episodes was that, in addition to reminding an audience that each person has been impacted by so many, Mr. Rogers provided time and space to both remember and honor the accumulation of vital, interpersonal experience. In the silence there was also the understanding and the awareness that each of us may be someone else's unforgettable person.

We usually associate the last day of October with candy and costumes, though there is a long, long history with "All Hallows Eve," which the western world, at least, has smushed into "Halloween." A little tid-bit of history is that Father Martin Luther posted his "95 Thesis" document on October 31st, 1517 (in Wittenberg, Germany) because All Hallows Eve signifies both remembrance and witness: remembrance of those who have died, and witness to the on-going faith of the living, and Luther's desire was to consider both the traditions and the future of Christianity. This long history comes with a bit of baggage, however, since the Church more or less borrowed this idea of celebrating the dead from other cultures (or adapted, or stole, depending on perspective) and a fair amount of those other cultural celebrations clung to Christianity – such as ghosts and goblins and skeletons.

Presbyterians downplay the talk of saints more-so than some of our Christian cousins, and even then we broaden the definition of saintly souls. When we take a moment to remember those who have encouraged and influenced us (in the manner of Fred Rogers), we are remembering saints who have gone before us, and celebrating saints in our midst. That's right: Presbyterians have such a broad understanding of saintliness that we even call people saints before they die! On All Saints' Sunday we pay particular attention to those who have died, and we celebrate both their glory and their imperfections. We honor their memory and in so doing we say to the world, and we remind ourselves, that God's love for us is never-ending.

It is a good time to remember – and to give thanks.





November 2023 – Strength in Flexibility: 35 Years of Presbyterian Women (An excerpt from Horizons, the magazine for Presbyterian Women)

The traditional gift to mark a 35-year anniversary is coral. While it's the gift for one of the milestone "multiples of five" anniversaries celebrated with gems and stones, coral is neither of those. Dubbed "the garden of the sea" or the "rainforest of the sea," this slow-growing organism isn't a plant either. Coral grows in groups. Coral is an animal that forms when a small organism called a polyp secretes a skeleton for support. When many polyps grow near one another, they form a reef, which functions as a single organism. Coral serves as a vital part of its ecosystem.

Like coral, Presbyterian Women is vital, strong, and works together. As we celebrate 35 years of PW, let's celebrate not just what we've made possible, but how. The most obvious "how" is our faith—our love from and for God, the teachings of Jesus, and the gifts of the Holy Spirit. We also have guidance from the PW Purpose, which articulates the ways we can offer protection, wisdom, and love to all of God's creation. We have the legacy of the women's organizations in Presbyterian churches that came before us-a tradition of more than 230 years. PW celebrates how we grow and serve together. 



