PASTOR'S NOTES Looking Back

I made at least one mistake this past year, and it was all because something different, something special came along. The whole thing started out simply enough, and was anything but planned or expected. I was watching a guy build a project, then another, and another, back in the early spring, and the guy was informative, casual, knowledgeable, and seemed to know what he was doing. Then, one of his projects was less about building something, or using particular tools, and more about the boots, gloves, and jeans that he "relied upon" for years, all of which were from small companies who made high quality goods.

Instead of watching another project, or turning my attention to anything else, I clicked on a link that took me to a bootmaker. Since I don't live on acres of timberland, nor volunteer for a rural fire department, it was pretty easy to dismiss a pair of heritage-quality boots that were crazy expensive. That is when I should have just gone back to watching a friendly dude build some interesting stuff, but instead, I clicked on the link that took me to a manufacturer of heritage-loomed, ring-spun, unwashed, heavyweight denim jeans that are produced in small quantities in the United States.

There is no impulse purchase to confess, however. No, it is worse than that. Time was spent considering quality, cost, value; comparing what might be better than the jeans I have been wearing diligently for over forty years. Yep, since my late teens I have worn the same style of a particular brand of denim jeans. There have been occasional forays into other styles, even other brands, but none have taken the place of what has been a decades-long mainstay of my clothing choices. Here, however, was denim that was different, special, and might be a worthwhile upgrade.

Maybe others have, like me, convinced themselves to try something different, to support small businesses, to elevate quality over quantity, to take a risk, to dare to be different – these are, after all, the kinds of encouragement that pastors and parents and teachers and coaches provide over and over. Except this time, there was one crucial piece of information ignored when convincing myself to order a pair of denim jeans that were 3 ½ times the cost of what I have diligently, consistently, faithfully worn from adolescence into adulthood.

Ignored, in the process of comparing and justifying, was the phrase, "no returns, no refunds." Of course that could be ignored, because so much time and consideration had been given to this decision, why would a return or refund be necessary?

There is another phrase that pastors and parents and teachers and coaches often say: "If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is." After days of comparing, considering, and, looking back on it now, willfully ignoring a potential problem in the guise of justifying an action, I placed the order. And, all these months later, I confess that heritage-loomed, ring-spun, unwashed, heavyweight, small-quantity denim jeans that are uncomfortable, that do not fit, that have awkward features, and cannot be returned, are now taking up space in my life. What a mistake!

In the season of Advent we often remember the Baptizer, out in the wilderness, with his camel-haired clothing and rustic diet. Not exactly unshrunk denim and blueberry muffins, yet the Baptizer's message of repentance – calling people to turn away from their mistakes – this message is also a reminder that the past informs, but does not define all that we are. In this time of reflecting on the past year and welcoming the new year, the Baptizer is also a reminder that mistakes do not overwhelm God's mercy and grace.







RPC SERVING OTHERS



Presbyterian Women of Ridglea, (PWR), Outreach, and the Matthew 25 Action Team thanks you, the RPC congregation, for your amazing generosity. These three groups work together with you to do the outreach of this congregation. At the beginning of 2024, we want to take a look back at all the wonderful things you accomplished in God's name for those in need.

<u>January</u> Our youth worked at West Aid for the Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday. We began the Second Sunday collection of your "spare" quarters for West Aid. The total collected is \$799.43! (Yes, we know those are not all quarters, and we gladly take the extra stuff.

February You donated over 150 Bears for Cook Children's Hospital Prayer Bear program.



<u>March</u> You collected and we distributed granola bars, fruit gummy snacks, and Rice Krispie treats to students participating in after-school extracurricular activities and sports at Western Hill High School.

April You contributed and we distributed toilet paper and cleaning supplies for the folks at the Quail Trail Community for recently homeless folks.

<u>May</u> You contributed pencils, pens, and wide-ruled paper for 60 boys at Hope Farms in the Como Community. We worked with Cook Childrens' Services and West Aid to Provide health care items to the RISE community.

June You contributed peanut butter & Mac & Cheese for West Aid, two of their staples.

July You collected school supplies for specific children in middle and high schools at PCHAS home in Waxahachie.

<u>August</u> You contributed uniforms of all sizes for students in need at Luella Merrett Elementary just up the street from the church. We also provided first day back breakfast for the teachers and staff. What a fun event. We filled backpacks with school supplies for the clients at West Aid.







<u>September</u> You contributed Bug Spray for the Day Resource Center helping the homeless.

October You contributed canned green beans, peas, corn, and canned soup for West Aid for Thanksgiving.

November You contributed items for the hygiene kits for those on the streets.

<u>December</u> You assembled the hygiene kits during an Intergenerational Sunday School time. We also donated 30 stockings filled to the brim for kids living at Waxahachie Childrens' Home.

During the year, we began a monthly birthday celebration for residents of Quail Trail. We provide \$25 Gift Cards, Birthday cake, and birthday cards for the people celebrating that month. Several times during the year, we helped with the Tarrant Area Food Bank (TAFB) distribution of items at Quail Trail.

Our special offerings included:

One Great Hour of Sharing \$4467.00

<u>Pentecost Offering</u> \$3136.30 total with \$1881.60 going to Grace Presbytery, \$1254.50 to Center For Transforming Lives (CTL).

Peace & Global Witness Offering total \$2694.20 with \$2020.65 going to Grace Presbytery and \$673.55 to Safe Haven.

Joy Offering was collected in December, and we don't have that total as this goes to press.

These are all over and above our budgeted benevolences. And while we're talking dollars and cents, this involves a lot of person hours by lots of folks doing our small bit to make this world a little closer to what God intends for God's people. What an honor it is to be on this journey together. In Matthew 25:40 we read: "I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me." All we have is from God. May we continue this generosity in 2024.
