PASTOR'S NOTES ANON

My office includes a few quirky things, some for conversation, some for focus, some for distraction, some for remembering, some for play. There are Lego vehicles, and candles, and Grandma Harwerth's candy dish, there are figurines, icons, balls of various shapes and sizes, mementos from previous congregations, and rocks. Quite a few rocks. There are

river rocks, volcanic rocks, a Petoskey stone, and a few others that have accumulated over the years. About a decade ago, in a little store in Joseph, Oregon, I came across a basket of geodes, all about the size of baseballs, and I snapped up seven or eight of them, mostly because the nearly-hollow, mineral-encrusted insides of a geode can be a fun way to illustrate the surprise of Easter – if one has a big enough hammer!

Then, there are the rocks that were left on the front porch of the church awhile back. One morning, in front of the outer doors leading into the sanctuary, there set a little half-pint jar with a couple of layers of wax dripping over the rim. Inside there are about nine or ten rocks, all of them highly polished and each a different color, such as blue, brown, beige, black, red, green and grey, and there is also a little velveteen bag. Tied to the jar with a ribbon there was a small, hand-written note: "A Satanist gave us these rocks. We sealed them to keep bad inside. Please help." And it was signed, "Anon."


From the moment I saw the note, and even now, I chuckle about this most unusual gift, and the quandaries therein. While there are people who call themselves "Satanists," as a Presbyterian pastor that belief system is, for me, akin to belief in a Flying Spaghetti Monster (that is a real thing, too). Also, there is the idea of sealing a jar because the rocks might contain badness — can that be true? There are icons around my office that people have brought from their travels (Cyprus, Nazareth, etc.), but should they, or are these icons somehow imbued with "holiness" similar to rocks that might contain badness? And then, there's "Please help. Anon." What help is being requested? Keep the rocks sealed? Turn them into holy rocks? And who is going to know? So many chuckles, so many questions, such a quandary, just looking at the jar – still sealed, for now.

For four years this small jar of shiny rocks has hung around. Is the jar still sealed because there is bad inside? Maybe, but probably not – that's what my understanding of theology leads me to conclude. The jar is still sealed to remind me that the beliefs of

others won't always line up with my beliefs. The jar is still sealed to remind me that looking good can be different than being good. The jar is still sealed, and the note remains with it, to remind me that people consider our place, our space, our community, to be trustworthy, helpful, and safe. That is why the jar is still sealed, and will continue that way, to remember, to focus, and to ponder.

It's summer, and while we aren't having Book Club, we're still busy. On Friday, last week a group of us met at the Quail Trail Community to help with the TAFB food distribution, and June 25 another group went to Quail Trail for the monthly Birthday Celebration. Through the generosity of members of our congregation, on June 25 we presented a \$25 Walmart Gift Gard and a birthday card to each resident who has a birthday in June. We also brought a birthday cake. For many of these folks, it's been

a really long time since anyone recognized their birthday. Thank you, members of RPC.

If these activities sound like something you'd like to be involved in, we'd welcome you. On **Friday**, **July 19**, we'll help with another **TAFB food distribution**. We get there by **9:15** and we set up the food and then help the residents as they come in to select what they want and need. We finish up by 11, sometimes earlier than that.

On **Tuesday July 30**, we'll have another **Birthday Celebration**. RPC members provide a ½ of a sheet cake and the Gift Cards and Birthday cards. Again this begins at **11 am** and finish up by 12:00 or 12:30. **Lynne Payne** coordinates this activity, so please contact her 915 -249-0789. If you cannot attend, you might consider contributing a Walmart Gift Card and or a Birthday card.

Come August we'll do these activities again. Food distribution is on Friday, August 16, and the Birthday Celebration is on Tuesday, August 27. The more we go to Quail Trail the more we get to actually know some of the residents. In Jim Wallis' book THE FALSE WHITE GOSPEL, he says we've all felt vulnerable at one time or another. He asks: "How can we connect that feeling of vulnerability with the vulnerability of the poor?" He says through Proximity. That's what our work with Quail Trail provides us. These are people just like us. They've just hit on more hard times than most of us. We hope you'll decide to join the RPC Matthew 25 Action Team. As we do it unto the least of these, we do it unto our Lord.


