Footsteps



About a dozen years ago, Shannon gathered a handful of musically-inclined colleagues in Muscle Shoals, Alabama to help him record an album, and included with the dozen or so songs he had written was "Boots of Giants." As the song unfolds, Shannon mentions a blues guitarist, two clergy colleagues, and his father. Throughout the song the message resounds: we often sit among the boots of giants, though we rarely realize this in the mo-

ment. In a little over four minutes, we begin to understand how some people provide lifelong influence, and that we often wait until it is time for a eulogy before we realize just how significant they have been.

During that week in Muscle Shoals, the evenings were a time for rehearsing, and laughing, and learning about the characters and situations that populated the songs, and Shannon gave us plenty of "between-the-lines" stories, including the four men mentioned in Boots of Giants. Let's just say that Shannon gladly emulated the musicality of that long-ago blues guitarist, but not his rambunctious lifestyle or questionable morals; we honored the memories of his dad, who died before any of us had known Shannon; the longest conversations were around those two clergy colleagues, whom some of us knew.

We eventually agreed that all those whom we consider saints contain flaws and failings, alongside goodness and virtue, and our respect for them is a weighing of those flaws and virtues. The importance, the impact, the lasting influence which some people have is, in large measure, a matter of circumstance and proximity. Our friends experience our parents differently than we do; some teachers and colleagues are more relatable to us than to our friends, and what some of us see as strength, others see as hurdles. Or, as Shannon might say, what some experience as the boots of giants, others might consider to be cast-off clodhoppers.

Even before the fifth century, the Church set aside time to remember all of the souls who have left this earthly life, yet who continue to influence the world. In the Protestant tradition we have expanded this to All Saints Day, which honors the life of those departed and encourages future generations to carry on grace-filled ministries of compassion and connection. For more than a millennium, November 1st is that day of remembrance, but of course, these memories, and these ministries, are deeper than a single day. A century and a half before Shannon penned Boots of Giants, Horatio Bolton Nelson wrote these lyrics:

By all your saints still striving, for all your saints at rest, Your holy name, O Jesus, forevermore be blessed! For those passed on before us, we sing our praise anew And, walking in their footsteps, would live our lives for you.

November Just Bring It: Stockings for Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services


