Quadragesima

Are any of us ready for the season to Lent? This annual opportunity for reflection and renewal is approaching in the middle of the month, and continues through March – those forty days between Ash Wednesday and Easter, not including Sundays. Pretty much every time we talk about Lent, we add “not including Sundays.” Ever wonder about that?

Before any other Christian celebration – before Christmas, or Transfiguration, or All Saints, or Epiphany, or anything else that Christianity might recognize with a special occasion, there was Easter. Throughout the first century and more of the early Church, weekly Sabbath gatherings were focused on the significance of Easter, the assurance of resurrection. Over decades and across a diverse and diversifying ministry, what is now called Holy Week, then Epiphany, and Pentecost, and Christmas were recognized and celebrated (many of them “borrowed” from local customs then adapted and “churchified”). Eventually there came to be a multi-week emphasis on contrition and confession, although it was infrequently associated with Easter, until the fourth and fifth centuries. Originally called *Quadragesima* (Latin for “forty days”), as this multi-week period of reflection became more closely aligned as a pre-Easter fast, its association with springtime slowly prompted the switch to the Anglo-Saxon word for spring, *Lencten*. However, during those centuries of growth and adaptation, the Easter/resurrection/Sabbath connection continued its prominence, leading to our now-centuries-old recognition that the season of Lent begins forty days before Easter, not including Sundays, which is why Lent begins on a Wednesday.

As we have done for a number of years, we will begin the season of Lent with a Service of Worship, which will include a soup supper (provided by session members) and the celebration of the Sacrament of Communion. This Ash Wednesday Service will be at 6 p.m. on February 18th.

Also beginning on February 18th will be our Lenten Study Series, each Wednesday at noon. We will be using *Lent in Plain Sight* by Jill Duffield, a devotional which utilizes ten “everyday” objects, such as shoes, stones, and bread. More information about the book will be in the weekly e-news. And in case you didn’t know, we also host “chair yoga” on Wednesdays at 1 p.m., so folks can come at noon to stretch their faith, and then at 1, gently stretch their bodies!

Social shifts of the last couple of decades keep pushing toward division more than connection, and keep pushing toward taking more than receiving. Each year, each month, each week it seems as if these divisive tactics are becoming more and more frantic. These frantic tendencies put strains on long-standing traditions of honoring our differences and holding value in our diversity. In such times, the Church provides a place to hold and celebrate open and affirming traditions, and the season of Lent is one such time.

Whether or not your schedule permits being with us for our weekly study series, we hope you find opportunities to reflect, connect, and renew during this Lenten season, as we strive to model our discipleship in an often-contentious world.

Hope you will join us!!



Bears must be brand-new with tags still attached as we have patients with suppressed immune systems

-“Gently used” bears cannot be distributed to our patients

-Avoid bears with wording, dates, logos, or brands

-Avoid bears with religious themes as we are an interfaith program

-Bears must not require batteries and must not move, speak, or sing

-Bears must be free of scents or fragrances (i.e. chocolate-scented Valentine's Day bears; candy-scented holiday bears)

-Please avoid microwavable and freezable bears (i.e. brands such as Warmies; Warm Pals; Thermal-aid)

-Please avoid weighted bears

-Please avoid bears with sewn-in magnets

-Please do not donate collectible bears, antique bears, or bears with resale value (this includes Boyd's Bears brand)

-The ideal PrayerBear size is 6” – 18”

-Please choose bears rather than puppies, kittens, unicorns, sloths, etc. – remember, it is the PrayerBEAR Program!

-As a general rule, the best type of PrayerBear is one that is soft and huggable!
